

## Our experience in Afghanistan



Mission Enfance has 17 years of experience in Afghanistan.

In this very poor country located on the borders of Central Asia, Pakistan, Iran and China, the history of the last forty years has been a succession of wars (against the ex-USSR from 1979 to 1989, then civil war, then conflict with Islamic terrorism and the Taliban).

Since August 2022, the Taliban have returned to power. The new regime applies Charya - Islamic law - to its people. Since then, Afghans have suffered the effects of the closure of their country's borders. The interruption of the international community's support and bad harvests have triggered a famine that affects 80% of the Afghan people today.

Since 2005, Mission Enfance has dedicated itself to the education of girls and boys, in particular in the Panjshir valley where it has built primary schools and a high school, but also in Mazar e Sharif where 2,800 pupils (girls and boys) attend our Bibi Nezafar high school.
